

#### **Celebrating Our Friends**

#### **Roz Woolf**

Roslyn Woolf, known for her long years of service as a teacher with the Waukegan Public Schools District and her variety of community service involvements, died, Saturday, November 17, 2007, after a two month battle with an aggressive form of leukemia. Roz served on the Friends Board along with her husband David, working particularly on the Nominating Committee and helping at the book sales.

Born on October 2, 1931, and raised in Waukegan, Roz became the second graduate from the first modern dance classes at the University of Illinois, receiving a BA in Physical Education and Dance. On June 29th, 1952, shortly after college, Roz married her fiancé, David Woolf, a professional musician. Focusing on a teaching career in elementary school, her first job was in Wilmette, then in the Waukegan School District at Lyons, Hyde Park and Cooke Magnet, until her retirement in 1988. While a teacher and mother of three, she received her Masters in Education through Roosevelt University in Chicago. After retirement, Roz continued to substitute teach, mentor younger teachers, and remain in the educational field.

The family has set up a scholarship in her name to help a deserving high school student attend college. Marge is a graduate of Waukegan High School, Marquette University and received her Masters Degree from Roosevelt

University. After teaching for the Catholic school system, she joined the staff at Waukegan High School in the Business Education Department as teacher and work/study coordinator.

Glenn and Marge both lost their spouses in 1987. Glenn had his own painting and decorating business after retirement, so when Marge needed work done on her house, Glenn was hired on to do the work and the rest is history! Glenn and Marge have been married 16 years and have 5 children, 9 grandchildren and 2 great-grandchildren between them. They are happy to serve on the Friends of the Library Board, with Marge currently serving as Secretary. You will see them working at the Friends Bookstore on most Fridays from 9 am until 2 pm.
