Elmer Stone Memorial Scholarship

In 2006, the Friends initiated a scholarship fund in memory of Elmer Stone. Elmer was a long time supporter of the Friends and a teacher at Warren Township High School. The first scholarship was for \$500.

Subsequently, \$500 dollar scholarships have been awarded each year. Last year two such scholarships were given. This year, thanks to the success of our sales and generous donations, we are pleased to announce that we will be awarding two \$1000 scholarships. Seniors from Waukegan, Warren Township, Zion, North Chicago and St. Martin de Porres high schools are eligible to apply for these scholarships. To qualify, students must have outstanding academic records and be able to show that they have provided community service during their high school years.

Funds for the scholarships are provided by proceeds from the teachers sale held annually in the fall and the sale of pop and cookies at the summer and winter concerts. We also encourage the generosity of members and others to provide funds to help us to continue to assist worthy students in their academic pursuits.

Proposed Amendments to the Constitution and By-Laws to be Voted Upon at the Annual Dinner

ARTICLE IV Structure Of Organization

SECTION 1 AMENDMENT: The Executive Committee shall be elected at the first regular board meeting following the Annual Meeting.

NEW SECTION 2: The Board of Directors shall meet monthly on a date determined by the Board. Upon agreement by the Directors, this protocol may be altered. A quorum for any meeting of the Board shall consist of half plus one of the elected Directors.

ARTICLE VII Finance

NEW SECTION 1: By June 1 each committee shall submit in writing an annual budget for operational expenditures to be approved by the Board of Directors. Committees shall have the authority to expend their budgeted funds. Any subsequent amended budget requests must be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval.

NEW SECTION 3: Any expenditures for merchandise to be sold must be approved by the Board of Directors.
